



EDITH PIERSON LINDSTROM

(Seventh President)

WAS BORN in Minnewaukan, North Dakota, on January 20, 1892. Graduated from the Minnewaukan High School in 1909 and in 1913 she received her B.A. Degree from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota.

The following year she taught in a day school for Mexican children under the direction of the Presbyterian Board of Missions in Chimayo, New Mexico.

In the fall of 1915 entered the School of Nursing of the Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, Minnesota, graduating in September, 1918. In fall of 1919 was appointed Public Health Nurse in Benson County, North Dakota, under the Red Cross, remaining there two and one-half years.

She was a member of the State Board of Nurse Examiners and President of the North Dakota State Nurses Association two years.

In August, 1928, she became Supervisor of Public Health Nursing and Health Education in the Social Service Department of the Babies Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

For the past two years she has been Secretary of the North Dakota State and Local Red Cross Nursing Activities Committee.

In October, 1930, she was married to Albert G. Lindstrom.
