MABEL OLSON was born April 8, 1888, in Fargo, North Dakota. Graduated from St. Luke's Hospital in Fargo, year of 1911. Entered military service, Army Nurse Corps, in 1917, assigned to duty at Camp Leurs in November. In August, 1918, ordered to New York. On September 2nd sailed for France in the Leviathan. Stationed at Neuf Chateau, Base Hospital No. 66, and later at Provisional Hospital No. 1 at Basoilles until June, 1919. Returned to U. S. A. and discharged from service in July. In September of the same year took three months of Public Health Course at University of Minnesota. From January to June of 1920 did Public Health work in schools at Moorhead, Minnesota. In November of same year she entered service of U. S. Public Health and was assigned to duty at Arrowhead Springs, California. In 1924 she was assigned a position as Aide in Occupational Therapy in U. S. Veterans' Hospital at Boise, Idaho, where she is at present.
